Principal's Message

You may not know this, but I have an undergraduate degree in English; I love a good story! As we begin this blessed season of Advent, I have three stories to share with you that hopefully will put the next 23 days or so into perspective for you. Give Advent a chance!

At mass on Sunday night, Father Santiago (All Saints) spoke about the importance of giving Advent the respect it deserves as its own time. Christmas is separate and for Christians, Advent needs reverence, preparation and participation. He talked about how high level athletes prepare for competition through practice, always envisioning what is needed on the 'big day'. That way, they are truly prepared, not surprised nor disappointed. If we prepare for the coming of Christ with the importance it deserves, we will be ready! In Advent, we are called to live our lives in that level of preparation, fine-tuning our hearts for the coming of our Lord.

At our leaders' retreat today, Mr. Aaron Skretting (Assoc. Superintendent with Holy Spirit) shared the importance of finding 'stable spaces': moments when we imagine the serenity, peace and rest that those in the stable that precious day experienced. Just pause and look at a nativity scene. Yes, the baby Jesus may have cried, but there is no denying the wonder that existed in that space. Where can you find those moments for yourself this season?

A colleague of mine, Josh Van Uden (St. Mary's Taber) spoke to me about Advent being like making a glass of powdered iced tea. You can make it too weak where you really don't taste much, or you can make it too strong, so it is almost unpalatable. But, if you really think about what that powdered recipe needs for you to say, "Ah, that is a good glass if iced tea", then you can know Advent. It needs a certain amount of flavor to be truly 'Advent' but we can adjust the seasoning a bit ourselves to make it meaningful and connected to our heart's desires. Make no mistake. Advent is not Christmas – it is not the Coke (or other extravagance) that you might be looking forward to. Give yourself a chance to be a bit slower, find some rest, make your 'perfect' cup of iced tea, and enjoy what Advent can give amidst the secular demands on your attention. You deserve it and your kids will thank you, too!

Yes, Advent is a mini-Lent: a time to check yourself, check in, and affirm that you are aligned with God's plan for you. Shopping, socializing, and deal-finding have nothing to do with Advent. Celebrate your choice to name Jesus as your personal saviour and let getting ready for Him be your 'holiday guide' this year.

This month, we celebrate community through our concerts on Dec 4 and Dec. 11, our mass and fellowship with friends at Children of St. Martha School on Dec. 17, our Christmas Turkey dinner for all on Dec. 18, and our annual pyjama day with Bingo on Friday, Dec. 19. Don't forget Spirit Week! Thank you to the volunteers who help our amazing staff get all of this off the ground so that <u>all</u> students can relish being themselves in the light of Christ!

On another note, information about boundary changes and any grandfathering plans for students on the west side will come out in January. Stay tuned for that and continue to pray for our school community. Happy birthday, Jesus! All the best to you and yours over the Christmas and New Year's Day break! We are back January 5!




Persistence in Prayer | Luke 11:5-13



Jesus said to his disciples, "Suppose one of you should go to a friend's house at midnight and say, 'Friend, let me borrow three loaves of bread. A friend of mine who is on a trip has just come to my house, and I don't have any food for him!' And suppose your friend should answer from inside, 'Don't bother me! The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.' Well, what then? I tell you that even if he will not get up and give you the bread because you are his friend, yet he will get up and give you everything you need because you are not ashamed to keep on asking.



And so I say to you: Ask, and you will receive; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For those who ask will receive, and those who seek will find, and the door will be opened to anyone who knocks.



Would any of you who are fathers give your son a snake when he asks for fish? Or would you give him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? As bad as you are, you know how to give good things to your children. How much more, then, will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

St. Monica

332-387 (Feast Day: August 27)



Monica was born in North Africa around the year 332. She had a difficult life. Her husband did not share her Christian faith and sometimes treated the family poorly. She also lived with her mother-in-law, which was challenging at times. Despite these struggles, Monica never stopped praying for her family and worked hard to set a good example for her children.

Monica had three children who survived infancy, the oldest being St. Augustine. Over time, her husband and mother-in-law converted to Christianity and were baptized, but soon after, her husband passed away. Augustine lived a rebellious life away from home, yet Monica continued to pray for him.

When Augustine traveled to Rome and then to Milan, Monica followed him to be near him. There, they both met St. Ambrose, who guided them in faith. In 387, Augustine was baptized, answering Monica's many years of prayer. On the journey home, Monica died peacefully, having seen her prayers bear fruit.


Saint of the Month - St. Monica

St. Monica and Persistence in Prayer

St. Monica lived in North Africa a long time ago. She loved God very much, but her son, St. Augustine, did not always make good choices. Monica prayed every day that he would come to know God's love. For many years, nothing seemed to change — but she never gave up.

Her prayers and patience helped lead Augustine to faith. He became one of the greatest teachers in the Church. St. Monica shows us that when we keep praying, even when it's hard, God is always listening and working in ways we might not see right away.


